
Celebrate and meet other mentors

### EXPANSION IN THE TRI-CITIES

Thanks to The John Randolph Foundation and generous Tri-Cities supporters, we are expanding school-based mentoring at Harry E. James Elementary, and introducing new programs at Dupont Elementary in Hopewell and Walnut Hill Elementary in Petersburg. Bigs, particularly men, are wanted to meet the need of students. Nearly 20% of students at these elementary schools are chronically absent kids enrolled in BBBS school-based mentoring report improving attendance by 25%.

Virginia State University students are driving engagement in Petersburg - the enthusiasm from a diverse group of students enrolled in activities as varied as the Reginald F. Lewis College of Business to the U.S. Coast Guard Pre-Commissioning Initiative is infectious! 


